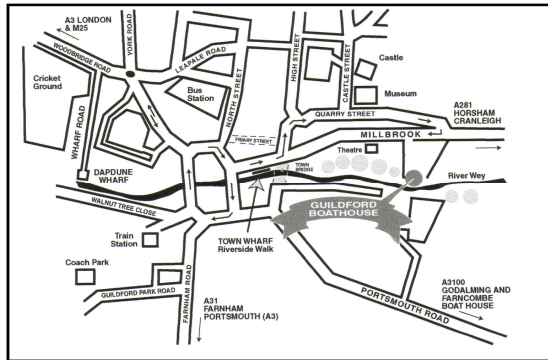


Where to find Guildford Boat House and Dapdune Wharf:



How to Book

- 1 Make a provisional booking:** call us to discuss availability and reserve the best date and time for you. Please try to have a back-up date/time in mind in case your chosen one is already booked.
- 2 Confirm your booking:** a £75 non-refundable deposit is required, normally within 7 days of your provisional booking being made. We will then issue an invoice showing what you have paid and how to calculate your remaining payment, and detailing the trip you have selected.
- 3 Make your final payment:** the balance is due no later than 14 days before the trip.
- 4 Payment Methods:** cash, cheque or card.
- 5 VAT:** the fare is zero-rated under present regulations. In the event of a change, you will be re-voiced at the new rate unless you have paid in full by the time of the regulation change.
- 6 Terms and Conditions of Hire:** bookings accepted are bound by the Company's terms and conditions, which are printed on the booking form/confirmation/invoice. All services are subject to availability, river conditions, weather etc and can not be guaranteed. Guildford Boat House reserves the right to make changes to the schedule when necessary and with out notice.



Coach Parking

There are 4 coach parking spaces at Guildford Park Road Car Park (off A31 Farnham Road) and 2 bays at Bedford Road, by the Odeon Cinema. In addition there are spaces for 10 coaches at Guildford Cathedral, which can be used whether you are visiting the Cathedral or not. Dropping off points are situated in Millbrook by the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre and also outside the Museum in Quarry Street.

Other local attractions:

To complement a boat trip, you might like to visit one or more of the following in and around the historic town of Guildford:

Loseley Park

A beautiful Elizabethan mansion set amidst magnificent parkland scenery. Attractions include house tours, walled garden, gift shop and courtyard tea room.

Guildford Cathedral

Set in a commanding hilltop position. The interior of pale sandstone and white Italian Marble floors creates lightness, space and tranquillity.

RHS Wisley

The famous 240 acre garden is the ideal place to see examples of horticultural excellence.

Painshill Landscape Garden

One of Europe's finest 18th century landscape gardens. Excellent café and shop selling wines produced from their own vines.

National Trust properties:

Clandon House, Hatchlands Park and Dapdune Wharf.

Guildford's ancient cobbled High Street, Guildhall, Castle, Museum and Guildford House Gallery are all within walking distance of Guildford Boat House.

Free guided walks start at **Tungate Arch.**

Shopping and eating out—Guildford caters for all your needs with a fine range of shops and restaurants.

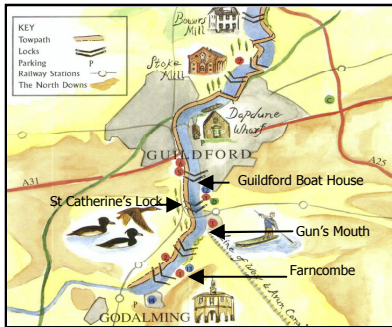

The River Wey

The Wey and Godalming Navigations flow for 20 miles from Godalming in the south to Weybridge, where the river meets the Thames. Most of it opened to navigation in 1653, a century before the Canal Age, when it was considered the fast and easy route to London, transporting a variety of goods including gunpowder. In 1964 Mr Harry Stevens, the last owner of the Wey Navigations, donated the river to the National Trust, who have preserved this historic waterway's peaceful and unspoilt character, making it truly one of Surrey's best-kept secrets.

The original Guildford Boat House opened at the beginning of the 1900's as 'Leroy's'. Since 1974 our family business has offered a choice of boating activities, including cruises aboard our two purpose-built trip boats, the 'Harry Stevens' and the 'Alfred Leroy'.



The Harry Stevens

Our trips operate from Guildford Boat House, located in the Millbrook Car Park just along from the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre.

The trips cover a stretch of water between Guildford and Godalming, and vary in length from 45 minutes to 1¾ hours. For a longer trip you can charter the boat privately — please ask for details.

The Harry Stevens is an open-sided craft (with roll-down blinds for all weather protection), and holds 60 people, with a minimum of 30 for group bookings. We reserve the right to sell remaining seats to the general public except where the boat is privately chartered.

We very much regret that space constraints and safety reasons mean that our craft are not suitable for the accommodation of the wheelchair-bound.

Trip A

45 minute return trip from Guildford Boat House

Leaving the Boat House, passengers travel south passing water meadows, St Catherine's Ferry (used by Pilgrims en route to Canterbury in days gone by), turning in front of St Catherine's Lock for the return. There are excellent views of Guildford Town and the Castle Keep.

Prices: Adult £5.00 Child (up to 14 years) £2.50

Trip B

1 ½ hour return trip from Guildford Boat House

An extension of Trip A, passing through St Catherine's Lock before turning at or near* the Gun's Mouth (junction with the old Wey and Arun Canal) for the return.

** actual turning point depends on time taken to get through lock.*

Prices: Adult £7.00 Child (up to 14 years) £3.50

Trip C

1 ¾ hour single journey between Guildford Boat House and Farncombe Boat House or vice versa

Subject to arrangement, this cruise may be combined with refreshments at 'Hectors on the Wey' Bistro at Farncombe Boat House.

Leaving Guildford Boat House, you travel south passing water meadows, St Catherine's Lock, under the lowest bridge on the river at Broadford, past the entrance to the old Wey and Arun Canal, and through a second lock at Unstead before arriving at Farncombe Boat House. This cruise can be taken in reverse.

Prices: Adult £9.00 Child (up to 14 years) £4.50



Trips to the National Trust Visitors Centre at Dapdune Wharf

Dapdune Wharf was once the barge-building centre of the River Wey Navigations. Visitors can now discover the secrets of Surrey's historic waterway through a series of exhibitions, models and displays. Fares do not include the cost of entry to Dapdune Wharf — these prices are available on application. Admission is free to National Trust members. Please contact the National Trust on 01483 561389 to discuss your group visit. There is ample parking at the Wharf and it is just a short walk back to the Town Centre. There are refreshments and a picnic area on site.

Trip D

1 ¾ hour single journey from Guildford Boat House to Dapdune Wharf via St Catherine's

Leaving Guildford Boat House, you travel south passing the water meadows to St Catherine's Ferry (used by Pilgrims en route to Canterbury), returning through Millmead Lock and the centre of town, passing the old warehouses, wharves and treadmill crane and finishing at the National Trust Visitors Centre at Dapdune Wharf.

Prices: Adult £8.00 Child (up to 14 Years) £4.00

Other trips may be available by special arrangement — we try to be flexible but if we really think something can't be fitted in we will say so!

Group trips are available every day except Monday and Friday.

Other Services

Remember we also have the 'Alfred Leroy' available for catered trips — min 25, max 49 people — with a wide variety of menus to choose from.
